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### MATHS IN FORM 5

Form 5 explored the concept of 'super structures' in maths and considered the mathematical concepts required to design and build structures such as The Shard, Petronas Towers or Burj Khalifa. They then had the opportunity to design and construct their own structures in small teams using 1kg of multilink cubes; the structures needed to be of a certain height, support increasing weight and also look appealing in appearance.

Form 6 completed a Brilliant Bridges lesson. The children explored famous bridges from around the world: their bridges needed to meet a number of criteria including a set width to span a river and height to accommodate a boat and passenger.

The children had great fun becoming engineers for the lesson and their constructions displayed a range of cunning ideas, clever building techniques and teamwork.
