



A MESSAGE FROM MRS SYRADD, OUR HEAD TEACHER

This half-term has been another busy one with new opportunities that continue to take St David's from strength to strength.

We were delighted to be awarded the ISA Award for Future Readiness. This was a national award which recognised the unique work we do to prepare our pupils for the future via the Dragory banking system and the classifieds job advertisements. As well as recognising curriculum initiatives such as Life Lab, Microsocieties, Debating and Philosophy. A big thank you to Mr Raffield who has driven the Dragory system from the start.

This term was the first time that younger children have had weekly swimming lessons. Form 2 have loved swimming at Royal Russell pool and they have amazed Mrs Hughes and Mrs Payne with their swimming ability.

Another first at St David's has been the introduction of Philosophy this term. As part of the Creative Curriculum KS2 pupils have been encouraged to ask questions and have an opinion. The topics discussed have ranged from bravery to friendship, from having a conscience to doing the right thing. I have been so impressed with the pupils' ability to think outside of the box and ask philosophical questions as well as being intrigued by their responses and reasoning. Ms Rogers has also been leading Philosophy for younger children where they are encouraged to ask 'Big Questions.'

As you know, pupil voice is a passion for me and it was wonderful to launch our new pupil ambassador role 'Unity Dragons.' They have led an assembly on anti-bullying alongside a range of activities and initiatives around school to promote kindness. Also, the School Council, led by the PLT, launched a successful playground poster

competition taking responsibility for judging it and sourcing prizes themselves. This initiative also aimed to remind pupils how to behave respectfully in the playground when playing with school equipment. Watch this space, as they have many exciting projects still to come.

We have continued to be active in our local community this half-term with a number of fixtures and sporting events with other local schools, participation in a Maths challenge at Royal Russell and singing at Tesco in Purley and Chestnut Care Home. Many thanks to those who generously supported Cygnus' chosen local charity Young Roots' alongside 'Crisis at Christmas' via our Christmas collections.

The last couple of weeks have seen the wonderful productions showcasing the talents of our pupils when it comes to singing and acting. Starting with 'Our First Nativity', EYFS got us well and truly into the Christmas spirit followed by the KS1 production of 'Lights, Camel, Action' which had us tapping our feet and laughing along as 'Strictly' fever hit St David's. This week it was wonderful to welcome so many of you to St Mark's Church where KS2 sang beautifully accompanied by talented musicians and confident speakers to deliver the Christmas story and remind us of the importance of being grateful of what we have at this time of year. ISA Awards 2025 Winner ISA Award for Future Readiness

St David's Preparatory School

We are thrilled to announce we have received the ISA award for 'Future Readiness!'

Starting with an idea driven by Mr Raffield and supported by the whole school, our Dragory banking system, school shop and School jobs are just a few examples of what is in place to prepare our pupils for the future.

Dragorys & School shop: Children can earn Dragorys and either save them for 10% interest or spend them at the shop. Form 6 get to channel their maths skills as our bankers.

Employment System: Teachers create adverts for jobs around the school for which children can submit an application, in the hopes of being shortlisted for interview and being awarded the job. Jobs are paid using Dragorys.

Oracy projects: Children take part in Philosophy discussions with Socrates the Dragon, debates, and participate in the English Speaking Board Exams.

Microsocieties: Pupils create their own Country with names, elected leaders, flags and explore the rules and governance of society.

Lifelab: Children decide upon their own business ideas with a budget and have to create, advertise and sell their products to the rest of the school.

On the Bimah we looked at an open Torah scroll (the five Books of Moses) and a yad. As we left we were given some Matzah bread (which is eaten at Passover) and some Challah bread (which is eaten on Shabbat) to taste. The man was really impressed with how many questions we could answer, and we all really enjoyed the trip.

for their designs, which were selected as winners by our School Council. These will be displayed around school for all to see






